Likely also a son of Gerhard Neufeld who had likely died before 1776 and a brother of Hermann (see below) and Jacob (b. 1770, bapt. 1789) who also immigrated in 1796-98.

Note: Hermann Neufeld exchanged his homestead with that of Heinrich Dyck of Chortitza and moved to Chortitza. Herman, Jr., was living with the Karl Jaegers (Geger) at Rosenthal in 1808.

22 Kornellus Penner (b. June 4, 1774, bapt. 1793) Neuendorf no date. This Kornelius Penner is very difficult to locate with reference to the list of 1776, since no dates are available in the Russian data. The above is therefore a speculation that he was a son of Peter Penner of Weißhoff (Danzig Gemeinde). Another possibility is that he was a son of Peter Penner of Neustädterwald and was baptized in 1794. Kornelius Penner apparently left no surviving wife or children and the homestead was liquidated ca 1802.

23 Arend Peters (b. 1783) Neuendorf 1808. Difficult to place with respect to the list of 1776, although possibly a son of Arend Peters, Schönsee 1776: 4 sons, 3 daus., Ladekop Gemeinde.

Note: Susanna Reimer came to Russia in 1803 with her brother Jacob. She was likely the daughter of Arend Reimer, Petershagen 1776: 1 dau., Tiegenhagen Gemeinde. If the above conjecture regarding the father of Arend Peters is correct, then he likely came to Russia with Peter Fröse (also an immigrant of 1796-98, Neuenburg 1802) his brother-in-law.

Note: Anton Sudermann is incorrectly listed in 1776 as Luttermann. He was originally from Danzig. One of his sons, probably Abraham, was living with another family in 1776. Abraham exchanged his homestead with that of Abraham Epp of Schönhorst and moved to Schönhorst. He gave up part of his tax-free years in exchange for a homestead already (partially) developed. Abraham Dyck was living with the Jacob Wiebe family at Neuendorf in 1802. Maria Pauls came to Russia in 1803 with her brother-in-law, Hermann Olfert. Kristina (Justina) Neudorf was a daughter of Giesbrecht Neudorf, an immigrant of 1803 who settled at Rosenthal (1808). In the Bergthaler Records, the birthdate for Aron Sudermann is listed in the Russian style as Dec. 16, 1792. Anna Lempke may have been a daughter of Jacob Lempke of Einlage (Russia).

26 Arend Sudermann (b. 1772, bapt. 1792) Neuendorf 1802, 1803, 1808. A son of Anton Sudermann, Schönsee 1776: 1 son, 1 dau., Ladekop Gemeinde, and a brother of the above Abraham Sudermann.
