 dep. Hamburg, Germany  
 dep. Liverpool, England  
 arr. at New York on the S.S. Hammonia 17 Jul 1874  
 immig. to Jansen, Nebraska  
 emig. from Jansen, Nebraska 1904  
 immig. to Blumenort, Manitoba  
 emig. from Friedensfeld [Ekron], Manitoba, visiting sister  
 Justina Warkentin in MN & mother in NE en route Nov 1915  
 arr. Meade, Kansas Dec 1915  
 moved to Satanta, KS (old file says May) 7 Apr 1920  
 (may have rented the land and sown the fields in  
 April, with the family moving in May 1)  
 visited Manitoba & Nebraska Nov/Dec 1938  
 emig. from Satanta, Kansas (*Christl. Familienfreund*) 2 May 1940  
 immig. to Hoffnungsau, Cuauhtemoc, Chihuahua, Mexico  
 (one of two "Kansas villages") (per stepson Abe Harder)  
 joined the *Altkolonier*, i.e., *Reinländer*, church 25 May 1940  
 lived in Blumenfeld while married Jun 1940  
 (based on information from stepson, Abe Harder,  
 confirmed as likely by George Rempel, Winckler; Franz Rempel  
 of Mexico says Harders originally lived in Friedensruh)  
 letter of 30 June postmarked Campo 16 (Blumenfeld) 4 Jul 1940  
 (with letter from his wife enclosed)  
 letter postmarked Heuboden, Campo 30 ("KS village") 8 Dec 1940  
 lived with cousin Sarah Friesen, Hoffnungsau\* 16 Jul-1 Nov 1941  
 lived with cousin Abraham E. Friesens\* 1 Nov 1941-1 Feb 1942  
 lived with young Isaac Duecks, Friedensruh\* 1 Feb-19 Jun 1942  
 lived with Johann Classens, Friedensruh\* 19 Jun-17 Aug 1942  
 d. Friedensruh, Cuauhtemoc, Chihuahua, Mexico 17 Aug 1942  
 (per obituary)  
 burial service, Reinland *Altkolonier* Church, Mexico 20 Aug 1942  
 m. Blumenort, Manitoba (I) 20 Nov 1904  
 (2nd marriage to Anna Giesbrecht [1883-1940], the widow of  
 Peter Harder [1875-1931] on 6 Jun 1940; she died later in 1940;  
 stepchildren: Katharina, Peter, Abram, David, Helena, Anna, per  
 obituary in *Christlicher Familienfreund*; Friedensruh was next to  
 Blumenfeld; 1924 *Kleine Gemeinde* members never established a  
 congregation and eventually joined the *Altkolonier* church after  
 they had given up hope of more *Kleine Gemeinde* members moving  
 there)
