

Wiens (b. 1789, the son of Johann Wiens [1756-1816], who migrated from Schönau, West Prussia, to Tiege 17, Molotschna) and Sarah Thiessen (pp. 498, 501). He would have been of the right age to marry the widow of Peter Unger (1815-1840s), but I find no further reference to any marriage or descendants.

Another possibility is the Jakob Wiens of about the same age (no birth date listed), son of Friedrich Wiens (1794-1845), married to a Hildebrand who died in 1831. Friedrich, in turn, was the son of Jakob Wiens (b. ca. 1762) who migrated from Einlage, Amt Elbing, West Prussia, to Schönau 7, Molotschna, in 1804 (pp. 504-505). Again, no there is no further reference to the younger Jakob's future, but his younger half-sister married a Gerhard Heidebrecht.

The daughters of Peter H. Ungers, in order, were called Maria (wife's mother), Justina (wife), Elizabeth and Anna. It seems likely that the paternal grandmother was also named Maria or Justina, since no potential paternal grandmother named Elisabeth or Anna can be found in the 1835 revision. On that basis, Peter H. Unger's mother was probably one of the following in what I consider to be the order of probability, with the data based on the 1835 revision list and Hermann Thiessen, *Peter Heydebrecht und seine Nachkommen*:

(1) Maria, b. ca. 1811, daughter of Johann (son of Johann) [b. ca. 1774], born to his first wife, Agatha; he moved from Chortitza to Blumenort in 1823 and then to Konteniusfeld # 40 in 1831, where they lived in 1835; this was the line of Johann, the third oldest son of *Stammvater* Peter

(2) Justina, b. ca. 1815, daughter of Abraham (son of Abraham), and his wife, Helena, nee Wiens; living in Fischau # 26 in 1835 (with her older brother Abraham, since her father had died there in 1833); this was the line of Abraham, the oldest son of of *Stammvater* Peter

(3) Maria, b. 29 Nov. 1817, daughter of Peter (son of Abraham, son of Peter) [b. ca. 1794], and wife, Maria, nee Blum [b. ca. 1792 to Catholic parents, but bapt. as a Mennonite], who is shown in the 1835 revision as arriving in Russia from abroad in 1827 and moving from Sparrau # 42 to Gnadenheim # 17 in 1834, where they lived in 1835; this is the line of Peter, the second oldest son of *Stammvater* Peter

My recollection is that Harold Unger told me that, according to his father, John F. Unger, Peter H. Unger corresponded with an uncle, Jakob Heidebrecht, of Didsbury, AB. Thus far I have been unable to find any trace of a Jakob Heidebrecht in Didsbury, although there is a Heidebrecht family there. But if we assume that there was such an uncle and that he was born prior to the revision in early 1835, then Maria, the daughter of Johann Heidebrecht, must have been Peter H. Unger's mother, for she had a brother Jacob, who was one year younger than she was.

But if this is the right father, we are faced with a confusing set of apparently inconsistent data and important omissions.
