Cornelius Epp: Letina, Cornelius Epp 1708-1805

Cornelius Epp was born in Danzig, West Prussia in 1708. He married for the first time to Sara Andree from the Schiebe near Danzig when the young couple settled in 1731 when they moved to Neuhuben. In 1755 Cornelius Epp was elected minister in Neuhuben and by 1760 he had become the leading minister of the Danzig Consistory. His first wife died in 1758 after which Cornelius Epp married for the second time to Christina East from the City Quarter of Danzig. She died in 1796 in Neuhuben. 19

According to the Konfirmation 1776 there was a Cornelius Epp living in Neuhuben of parental origin, with no siblings, and having no children or female servants. However the Konfirmation of the right Cornelius Epp in the Konfirmation indicates that he only moved to Neuhuben in 1791. It is also possible that this is the correct family as all of the children would have been married and or their wives by 1776.

In his Kirchen Aufschreibebuch it is stated that in 1776 the right wife of Cornelius Epp was Sara Andree and Maria Epp, daughter of the deceased Anna Jan Peter Epp, who was engaged to the son of the deceased Peter Epp. The Konfirmation of the right Cornelius Epp in 1791 indicates that he was married to Christina East and happily with their sons until 1804 when they decided to emigrate to America where they settled in the village of Peter Sagen.

By the time Cornelius Epp was old, and perhaps blind, they have been in the care of his son Agathe, M. A. in 1805. In the last will of the same village, 1811, the will of Agathe, M. A. 1805, Jakob Wiers, minister of the Church, Göttingen, 1805. Below regarding Cornelius Epp, "I must have been married and not counting the Honourable Cornelius Epp who was unable to tender much service because of his age, although he is quite well
