Section Six. Wilhelm Epp

Another son by the name of Wilhelm Epp died in 1781 in Neumunsterberg. A Wilhelm Epp family, "radical stock", property owner, is listed in the Versignation 1776 in Neumunsterberg and is possibly the same. The family consists of father and wife, one son and three daughters. Nothing further is definitely known about Wilhelm Epp or his family.

One speculation based on the work of R. H. M. is that Class Epp, settled in Marzbach No. 1 in Petershagen, died in 1800 was a son or other relative of Wilhelm Epp. According to the Marzbach No. 1 records, Class Epp was born in 1740, died in 1800, m. Agatha Epp, m. 1760, m. 1765, m. 1770, m. 1775, m. 1780, m. 1785, m. 1790, m. 1795, m. 1800. Although possibly partly correct, the same date is given for 1800. Class Epp died on May 27, 1812. The fact that Class Epp had a son Wilhelm raises the possibility that he was the son of Wilhelm Epp. The fact that Class Epp was buried in the Marzbach No. 1 church in Petershagen makes it possible that another relative would settle there. The fact that Class Epp's mother-in-law was a Klason makes it possible that Class Epp of Petershagen and Family No. 12 in the 1800 census are related to the Class Epp. The records of the church are as follows: "Class Epp, born 1740, died 1812, m.
