2 Mike Hornbaker is of the view that Heinrich von Beargen (born 1778) who emigrated to Fischau, Molotschna, was the son of Heinrich von Beargen (born 1746) and that he had left the village of Horst, near Danzig, somewhat later to join his parents in the Molotschna Colony and took over the parental Wirtschaft 4 in Fischau by the time of the 1808 Revisionsliste.<sup>31</sup> Mr. Hornbaker has concluded that Heinrich von Beargen (born 1778) was the father of the Beargens listed by Bernhard Baergen in A Bargaen-Neufeld Genealogy, namely, Isaac Beargen (1821-1875) of Mountain Lake, Minnesota, and Johan Baergen of Furstenwerder, Molotschna.<sup>32</sup>

3 Son Isaac Beargen (1821-1875) was married to Justina Lowen and the family lived in Alexanderwohl, Molotschna. Mrs Beargen was the widely renowned "Doctor Bergensche" of Mountain Lake, Minnesota.<sup>33</sup> She was married for the second time to Gerhard Neufeld (1827-1916) Altster of the First Mennonite Gemeinde at Mountain Lake, Minnesota, from 1878-1909.<sup>34</sup> Son Johan Bergen was married for the first time to a Helena Braun and for the second time to a widow Thum. The family lived in Furstenwerder, Molotschna. His son Isaac Bergen (1855-1929) settled in Henderson, Nebraska, in 1878. Another son Johan Bergen evidently remained in Russia, also resident in Furstenwerder. Son Heinrich Bergen (1858-1934) remained in Russia. Daughter Katherina Bergen (1846-1939) married Jakob Friesen, and lived in Inman, Kansas.<sup>35</sup>

3 In The Bergen History Mike Hornbaker lists three more children of Heinrich von Beargen (born 1778) all of whom are to have lived in Fischau, Molotschna, at some point. Daughter Aganetha Beargen (1822-1895) married Heinrich Friesen (1822-1903). The family evidently lived in Nibelaidorf, Molotschna, before emigrating to Inman, Kansas, in 1877.<sup>36</sup> If the information is correct that Aganetha Beargen (1822-1895) was a sister to Isaac Beargen (1821-1875) of Mountain Lake, Minnesota, then their oldest son Jakob Friesen (1848-1899) married his first cousin Katherina
