3 Daughter Anna Beargen (1825-1891) married Peter Esau (1824-1872). After his death in Fischau in 1872 Gerhard Enns of Fischau was appointed as her guardian. The widow Esau emigrated to Inman, Kansas, together with her guardian and brother Bernhard Beargen in 1876. According to family tradition son Bernhard Beargen served as Schulz of the village of Fischau. He lived near Inman, Kansas, for most of his life but died in Medford, Oklahoma, where some of his children had homesteaded.²⁸

Wilhelm von Beargen (1774) Lichtenau, Molotschna.

1 According to a letter of Ulrich Dueck Wilhelm von Beargen (born circa 1735) who lived in Mierauerwalde and died in Neumuensterberg in 1805 was the father of Wilhelm von Beargen (born 1774) who settled in Lichtenau, Molotschna, in 1804. Wilhelm von Beargen (circa 1735-1805) was married for the first time to Catharina Reimer and for the second time to Catharina Wall the daughter of Isaac Wall.²⁹ She married for the second time to Johan

2 Daughter Catharina von Beargen "married Peter Born the operator of a water driven mill from here."³⁰ Their son Peter Born evidently emigrated to Russia with his uncle Wilhelm von Beargen in 1804.³¹ Son Johan von Beargen (born 1790) was the great grandfather of Fritz Bergen the editor of Der Berg a periodical dealing with the history of the von Beargen family which appeared from 1936 to 1941.³² An estate settlement of 1811 records refers to Helena von Beargen as the widow Huebert. Paul Epp from Neumuensterberg is shown "as trustee for the two that are absent, namely, Wilhelm von Beargen and Mrs Gerhard Ensz, nee Judith von
