

WEST PRUSSIAN MENNONITE CHURCH RECORDS

Gustav Reimer, "Rescued Documents", The Mennonite Quarterly Review, #23, 1949, S, 99-104. [Res. Reg. #724]

[Gustav Reimer brought with him on his flight from Marienburg, West Prussia, to the British Zone of Germany late in the winter of 1945 a number of Mennonite church and genealogical documents, which in 1949 were still in his personal possession.] The following family tree was listed on page 104:
