

Another possibility is raised by B.H.Unruh, op.cit., 360, who refers to a "Gertrude van Bergen, Ruckenau, maid with family Kryeger" who also emigrated to the Molotschna in 1818, and who granted a release or satisfaction piece (presumably for an estate settlement), prepared in Halstadt, together with Jakob and Martin J.Barkman of Ruckenau. This would seem to indicate that she may have been a sister or some other close relative. *It would also be possible to have been above in 1818 when the brothers left Russia.*
