Another possiblity is raised by B.H.Unruh, op.cit., 360, who refers to a Gertrude van Bergen, Ruckenau, maid with family Krueger, who also emigrated to the Molotschna in 1818, and who is granted a release or satisfaction piece (presumably for an estate settlement), prepared in Halstadt, together with Jakob and Martin J.Barkman of Ruckenau. This would seem to indicate that she may have been a sister or some other close relative. If would satisfact the same with the same with
