These nine were born in Prussia (Germany). All, but Peter, moved to Russia. Here the boys had to change the name "van Riesen" to "Frisen" because the government would not allow such with names of descendants of emperors. Others changed them to Riesen. Migrations to Russia began in 1787. Some had 2 wheeled carts and an animal, but most had only wheelbarrows to move with. The Prussian government deprived them of most of their property before they left.
