Father Wilhelm Thiessen died while we were in Honolulu, Hawaiian island on our way back from China. Cousin J. J. Thiessen broke the news to us on the boat before we got off in San Francisco. Cousin Hy. T. Krause met us there also. Mother Sara Thiessen's death telegram was handed me when I left the schoolhouse at noon Jan. 17, 1925.  
 Mother told us that when father was to come to ask for her sister Elisabeth (Wooers always went on horseback then) she, being much younger, was sent to the street quite often to see whether (1) school was coming. How mother & sister had been very busy.
