David D. Schultz, son of David and Susanna Voth Schultz, was born in Cottonwood county, Minnesota, May 9, 1880. Living with pioneer parents on a farm, his education was limited, but with him education was a life-long quest for the higher values and principles of integrity and faithfulness which he sought to instill in the minds of his children.

Early in his teens during an illness which appeared to be terminal, he came into a personal relationship with God and he received the assurance: "Your sins are forgiven." In his adult life he followed the Lord in baptism.

On June 23, 1905 he was united in marriage to Anna Eitzen. To this union seven children were born. After living for six years on the parental farm they settled on 160 acres of bare land on which they erected their farmstead; retiring in 1942 to Mt Lake.

He was involved in many worthwhile causes. As a charter member of the Alliance church, he actively participated in three major building programs. For many years he served on the church executive committee, German Bible school board, the Bethel Hospital board, enthusiastically promoted the Eventide Home, was an active member of the Gideons and participated in various civic projects.

In August 1967, Mr. and Mrs. Schultz entered the Eventide Home and since August 1968, Mr. Schultz had been confined to the hospital and nursing home. He went to be with the Lord on Dec. 24, 1968; attaining the age of 88 years, seven months and 15 days.

He is survived by his wife, Anna; four daughters: Mrs. Cornelius (Hilda) Tieszen, Rochester, Minn.; Susan A. Schultz, Wilmore, Ky.; Elizabeth K. Schultz, Burundi, Africa and Mrs. Robert (Frieda) Ranney, Chicago, Ill.; two sons: Ferdinand Peter Schultz, Riverton, Wyo. and Samuel J. Schultz, Wheaton, Ill. Also two sons in law, one daughter in law, Mrs. S. J. (June) Schultz, seven grandchildren, six great grandchildren, one sister, Mrs. Helen Rahn, Eventide Home, and one brother, Peter Daniel Schultz, Wichita, Kans. He was preceded in death, in addition to his parents, by an infant son, Alvin, one grandson, four brothers and one sister.
