Jacob J. Loewen was the son of Jacob F. and Lena Dick Loewen. He was born in Carson township, Cottonwood county, Minn., on Dec. 8, 1911.

He received his elementary education in the rural schools, attended the Mt. Lake Bible school and the public school, graduating with the class of 1932.

He was baptized on June 9, 1935 and upon confession of his faith, received into membership of the Gospel Mennonite church by the Rev. H. H. Quiring, and in 1942 became a member of the Bethel Mennonite church by letter of transfer, remaining an active member of the church, serving in many departments of church and Sunday school.

He grew to manhood on the family farm after which time he moved to Mt. Lake and worked at various vocations until 1939 when he entered into partnership with Ray Dick, operating a service station for several years. In 1946 he entered the men's clothing business as a partner with Menno Wiens. This partnership was dissolved on Jan. 1, 1959. Since that time he had operated Jake's Clothing store.

On Sept. 20, 1940 he was united in marriage to Elizabeth Esau; to this union two daughters were born.

On Saturday evening, Dec. 20, Jake complained of not feeling well. The doctor was called to his home and his illness was diagnosed as a coronary heart attack. He passed away suddenly at about 8:00 p.m., attaining the age of 58 years and 12 days.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth, two daughters: Mrs. Brian (Marjorie) Schrag, Iowa City, Ia., and Mrs. Dale (Margaret) Schrag, Arvada, Colo.; two brothers: Harry Loewen and Abr. J. Loewen, both of Mt. Lake; five sisters: Mrs. P. W. Nickel, Mrs. Ben Heide, both of Mt. Lake; Mrs. Francis Saeger, Bemidji, Minn.; Mrs. John Wilmoth, Marshalltown, Ia., and Mrs. David Dick, Windom.

He was preceded in death by his parents and three sisters. Blessed be his memory.
